Bill Number	Title	Description
HEALTH		
SB2339 HB2125	RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.	Requires every pharmacy to accept for disposal the return of any unused prescription drug that the pharmacy previously dispensed.
SB2340 HB2126	RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.	Ensures certain ACA benefits are preserved under Hawaii law, including: coverage for children to age 26; prohibiting preexisting condition exclusion; and prohibiting using gender to determine premiums or contributions.
SB2341 HB2127	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.	Requires health insurers to provide comprehensive coverage for reproductive health. Requires reimbursements, for individuals who can become pregnant and are eligible for medical assistance but for their citizenship status. Prohibits discrimination in the provision of reproductive health care services.
SB2342 HB2128	RELATING TO VICTIMS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE.	Requires health insurance to cover clinical services for victims of sexual abuse who suffer from mental disorders.
REDUCING VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN		
SB2343 HB2129	RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.	Amends various sections of the HRS in order to more effectively address domestic violence cases.
SB2344 HB2130 HB1614	RELATING TO AUTOMATIC RESTRAINING ORDERS.	Automatically imposes a restraining order upon filing for annulment, divorce, or separation to preserve the financial assets of the parties.
SB2345 HB2131	RELATING TO SEXUAL ASSAULT.	Establishes a Team to address the manner in which sexual assault kits are processed and tracked, and to ensure that victims of sexual assault are informed of their rights under the law.
SB2346 HB2132	RELATING TO ADDRESS CONFIDENTIALITY.	Establishes an address confidentiality program to help survivors of domestic abuse, sexual assault, and stalking to keep their addresses confidential.
SB2347 HB2133	RELATING TO POLICE DEPARTMENTS.	Clarifies that complaints against a police officer alleging acts of domestic abuse shall not be required to be filed as a notarized or sworn written statement.
SB2348 HB2134	RELATING TO VIOLATION OF PRIVACY.	Establishes the act of threatening to disclose a pornographic image or video as a misdemeanor offense. Expands the offense of "violation of privacy" to include revenge pornography. Makes "violation of privacy" of a minor, a separate class B felony, instead of a class C offense.
SB2349 HB2135	RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.	Requires law enforcement and emergency medical services agencies to have policies, procedures, and training addressing lethality assessments and safety planning for victims of domestic violence in order to receive certain funds.

SB2350 HB2136	RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE.	Requires employees and employers to contribute to an insurance fund to be used to provide family leave benefits in order to care for a designated person. Appropriates funds to implement the program.
SB2351 HB2137	RELATING TO EQUAL PAY.	Prohibits employers from requesting or considering an applicant's salary history as part of the application process or compensation offer. Prohibits enforced wage secrecy and retaliation or discrimination against employees who disclose, discuss, or inquire about their own or coworkers' wages.

SB2352 HB2138	RELATING TO PROTECTION OF CHILDREN.	Amends the HRS to increase protections for child victims of sex trafficking, prostitution, and commercial exploitation by increasing penalties.
EDUCATION		
SB2353 HB2139	RELATING TO DISCRIMINATION IN EDUCATION.	Adds a section to the HRS that provides a State corollary to the federal Title IX protections in any educational program that receives state funds and expands the definition of sex to include gender identity or expression, or sexual orientation.
